### What are your mode(s) of communication with students?

I post a video in schoology each morning that is an overview of the day, the assignment, and any other announcements. I post any assignments or lesson videos in their respective folder on Schoology. Once things are posted, I send a Remind message to the students telling them it has been posted. For students that don't have Remind, I send them an email. I have a zoom session each day for each grade where they can log on to ask questions and get help. If a student needs help outside of the zoom time, they email or message me on Remind.

### How are you teaching lessons?

I make videos of the lessons on my iPad. I tried out various methods but have decided that Explain Everything is the best fit for me at this point.

### What is your feedback for students? How are you giving that feedback?

Assignments that would have been given in the classroom have been split into multiple days. The first day, I respond with what they could/should do differently. The second day they do the second half, but I have been sending them voice messages, video messages, or links to a YouTube video with an explanation of how to fix them. (If the first day is SUPER incorrect, I will try to intervene that day if their scheduling allows.

### How have you organized classes for remote learning?

My classes are set up in Schoology. The Schoology classes were utilized in the physical classroom so that was a natural transition.

### What are your mode(s) of communication with students?

Weekly emails sent on Monday morning covers previous week's assignments and what is due for the week ahead

Daily Check-In form on Schoology where students get their daily assignment

Office Hours (M-F) via Zoom from 9-10 a.m. and 2-3 p.m.

Remind group set up for each class so students can "text" for a response

### How are you teaching lessons?

When completing Daily Check-In form (dated for student reference) on Schoology, students are given their daily assignment. Each assignment is located in Schoology.

Lessons may be taught with a recorded lecture, written directions, available videos found on the topic, etc.

### What is your feedback for students? How are you giving that feedback?

Comments on submitted work (via email and/or Schoology).

### How have you organized classes for remote learning?

Each class has a Schoology course.

Most classes alternate between daily assignments and a project that spans multiple days.

Daily assignments may consist of a recorded lecture/lesson and supplemental worksheet or activity.

Most daily assignments should take between 10-30 minutes. Multiple day projects have individual components that have a recommended daily time frame of 20-30 minutes.

### What are your mode(s) of communication with students?

Whole class email at the beginning of the week outlining assignments along with materials or where materials can be found. For dual credit classes on Google Classroom this email is also put on the class homepage. Schoology for LA classes and Google Classroom for dual credit has been the primary source for assignments because units were already stored there.

### How are you teaching lessons?

Most of the readings are online and I have provided the necessary notes and extra materials. I have completed two lectures via QuickTime screencast and will continue to do so.

Feedback is being given through Google Classroom, Schoology, or Email depending on the assignment and how it was turned in.

**How are you teaching lessons?**

I'm mostly doing new content via screen recordings created on my iPad. I split videos into parts and upload into Desmos activities with questions throughout.

I've done Zoom sessions for more difficult topics.

I'm also using Quizizz and Kahoot! for practice/review of content.

**What is your feedback for students? How are you giving that feedback?**

I respond to student work in Desmos activities, and they can view my feedback, many activities have checks built in too. Students submit HW and I try to catch misunderstandings, and email them. Students receive written feedback on quizzes, then can revise and resubmit.

**How have you organized classes for remote learning?**

Activities are sent out the previous evening to be completed the next day. HW is due the following day at midnight (so an activity sent out Wednesday night would have HW due Friday at midnight).

Students typically have one new topic per day or a practice/wrap-up day of more difficult material.

Everything's posted in folders on Schoology and sent out in daily email.

Assessments are written in a more open-ended "at home" form. Tests have a time limit and multiple versions.

Google classroom is the primary way I communicate with students. Some students have reached out via email and I have responded using email.

Each school day I post a PE activity for students to complete on google classroom. Sometimes it's a list of exercises to complete (circuit training). I also post youtube videos of exercise routines. My goal primarily, is for the students get some physical activity during the day similar to if we were still coming to school.
