- Execute tabletop exercises including local first responders and crisis response team
- Implement safety recommendations from external review

Action to be taken:

- Coordinate quarterly tabletop exercises with local first responders and crisis response team - Initiate in April of 2023
- Coordinate with MSHP for casualty care training for selected staff/faculty January 2023
- Exercise evacuation and reunification drill September 2023

Changes made in the last two years:

- Training and certification of District Safety Coordinator, August 2022
- Implementation of CrisisGo for emergency communication, January 2023
- Courage2Report, Summer 2022
- Publishing new maps with numbering for doors and hallways, Fall 2022
- OpenPath access for first responders, Fall 2022
- Football bleachers brought up to safety code through renovation, Summer 2021
