Success of program based on the data (benefits):

- At the conclusion of the 2022-2023 School year, 63% of middle schools Math students met the i-Ready Growth Goal for the school year
- At the conclusion of the 2022-2023 School Year, 45% of middle school ELA students met the i-Ready Growth Goal for the school year
- At the conclusion of the 2022-2023 School year, 47% of elementary math students met the i-Ready Growth Goal for the school year.
- At the conclusion of the 2022-2023 school year, 54% of elementary ELA students met their I-Ready Growth Goal for the school year.
- All Science state assessment scored above the state average in the top two categories of Proficient and Advanced.
- 10% Increase in APR score from 2022 APR to 2023 APR
