Success of program based on the data (benefits):

The Elementary holds two activity nights throughout the year, focusing on reading and math. The Title Reading and Math teachers present on a relevant topic to parents that choose to come. The event is open to all parents to attend. Open house events: preschool, kindergarten and grades 1-5

The High School host several events that successfully involve and engage parents. iPad rollout is an annual event with over 90% of parents attending yearly. Outside of handing out iPads for students, different student organizations and activities are present for recruitment opportunities. The High School also has 6th-grade and 9th-grade orientations. These orientations are instrumental in the transition for students as they move from the elementary to the middle school and the middle school to the high school. 6th and 9th-grade orientations share vital information for parents to know and allow an opportunity to ask questions directly to teachers and administrators. During the spring semester, 8th grade and 12th grade have awards night. The high school has also hosted FAFSA Frenzy, NHS induction, FSA ID night, Decision Day, Career Fair, Senior Awards Day along with several FFA events, and choir/band concerts.

The district host two nights of parent teacher conferences in the fall and in the spring with high levels of parent participation. The district also hosts Showcase Days open to all community members. Title 1 parent survey in the spring and CSIP surveys are sent out annually for parents to provide feedback.

Recommended changes needed to achieve the goals and objectives of the program:

This years Spring Activity night is family based after school hours, to encourage families to come and learn reading and math activities with their student. All of the materials will be things that can be done at home with simple materials, that we will provide.

Collaboration with the local RPDC to get information and materials for families regarding reading and updated legislation.

This year, a Title 1 meeting will occur, which parents will be invited too attend.

Looking to the future with legislation that has been passed, we in the elementary feel that we may need to have more parent nights, to inform parents of the changes in RSP(Reading Success Plans) and how they can help their child at home.

With the College and Career Advisor grant KCR-1 was awarded last year, there are several opportunities to increase parental communication and involvement including: Decision Day, College Planning Events, and Parent Night.
