## Action to be taken:

- Update and simplify emergency response plans and language
- Coordinate annual tabletop exercises with local community and crisis response team in March of 2025
- Attend continuing education opportunities
- Improve communication with the community for safety/security issues

  - Neighboring districts
  - Parents/families
- Expand casualty care training to select staff/faculty during the year

- OpenPath access for first responders, Fall 2022
- Implementation of CrisisGo for emergency communication, January 2023
- STRATEGOS/Active Shooter Response Certification, June 2023
- Installation of highway safety lights, October 2023
- STRATEGOS/Bus Driver ASIR certification and training, Summer 2024
- Playground improvements, Summer 2024
- Master key access for first responders, Fall 2024
- Secure front entrances to high school/central office and elementary school, Fall 2024
