Recommended changes needed to achieve the goals and objectives of the program:

- Increase lessons in secondary classes
- Working together to create a Comprehensive School Counseling Program (multiple year process)
- Forming a School Counseling Advisory council that meets on, at minimum, twice a year
- Exploring options for transition between buildings

Action to be taken:

- Continue 4 year plans for high schoolers
- Continue ICAP meetings with 8 - 12th grade students
- Continue high school planning lessons with 8th grade
- Continue using the tools of Missouri Connections
- Living Lockers in the middle school
- Continue to use Quaver in the elementary for each grade level to ensure consistent implementation
- Continue use of animal-assisted therapy with Floki
- Senior Raffle
